"My favourite part was making cards and drawing at the pub!" – Jasper

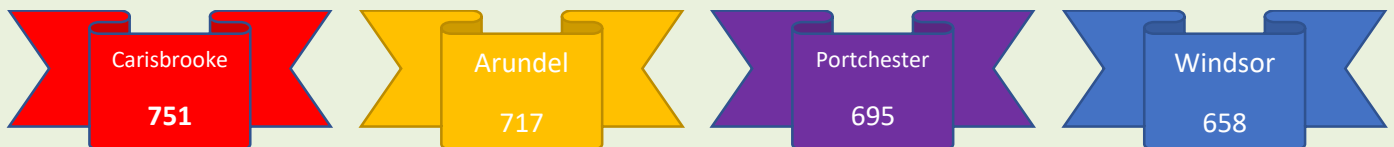

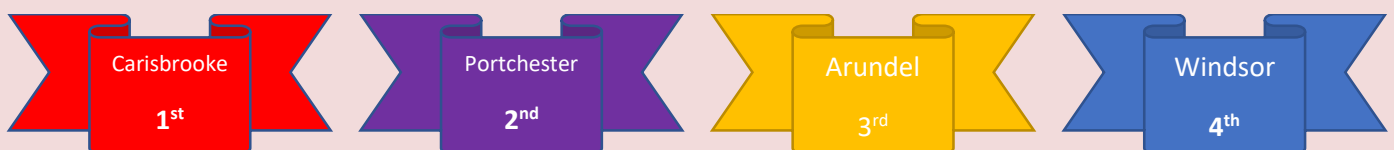
