<b>Reading</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Read for at least twenty minutes each day.</li> <li>• Choose an activity each day from the reading rainbow activities.</li> </ul>
<b>Spelling</b>	<p>This week we will be revising adding suffixes -ment -ful -less and -ly. Use these BBC video clips to help you remember the rules for adding suffixes: <a href="#">BBC clip 1</a>, <a href="#">BBC clip 2</a> Print the look, cover, write, check sheet to practise spelling the words or copy them into your home learning book. Once you're feeling confident, try the quiz on purple mash, or play this BBC <a href="#">game</a>.</p>
<b>Writing</b>	<p>By the end of this week you will have a published final copy of a 'How to' guide, this will be a set of instructions on how to do an activity of your choice. Think about your skills and interests, you might write 'How to play Roblox', 'How to bake cupcakes' or 'How to draw a unicorn', the theme is up to you!</p> <p>Use the following steps to help you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Oak National Academy has 5 English lessons building up to writing a set of instructions, view the sequence of lessons <a href="#">here</a>, Complete the 5 online lessons.</li> <li>• Instructions tell you what to do, choose a <a href="#">Rob Biddulph video</a> and follow his instructions to draw your own cartoon character:</li> <li>• To write effective instructions you need to use command sentences. Follow <a href="#">this</a> BBC bitesize lesson for a refresher in how to write commands.</li> <li>• Decide what your own instructions will be about, think about the steps you'll need to include and plan your instructions using drawings in your home learning book, or use the frame set as a 2do in Purple Mash.</li> <li>• Write your instructions into your home learning book or type it up on Purple Mash using the template. Can you include: A list of equipment with commas, Numbers, Bossy verbs, Adverbs (slowly, quickly), Punctuation, and Time adverbials (first, next). <b>Challenge:</b> add extra details, e.g. instead of 'Heat up the milk' you might write 'Heat the milk in the microwave for 2 minutes until steam starts to rise off it. Don't forget to protect your hands when you take it out!'</li> <li>• Edit and improve your instructions. Check your spellings, capital letters and punctuation, see if you can add or change any of your word choices to make them even more exciting.</li> <li>• Share your instructions with someone at home and ask them to give you some feedback. What have you done well? What could you do to make them even better?</li> </ul>
<b>Maths</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Complete the next 5 year 2 lessons available on the <a href="#">White Rose website</a>, watch the videos before trying each activity to show you what to do.</li> <li>• Play on Timestable Rockstars 3 times this week – check out this week's battle!</li> <li>• Complete at least 3 'To Dos' on Purple Mash</li> </ul>
<b>Curriculum Task: Geography</b>	<p>Complete the <a href="#">BBC lesson</a> on the countries in the UK, including the labelling challenge. Choose a place in the UK to find out about, it could be somewhere you've been or a place you'd like to visit. You could look it up on <a href="#">google maps</a>, search on google or a safe search site, such as <a href="#">kiddle</a> to find out 5 facts about your place to write in your home learning book. What is special about it? What can you do there? Use google maps to find out how far it is from Kings Worthy.</p>
