We are currently looking to recruit an energetic, enthusiastic and physically fit Site Assistant to work alongside our current Site Manager in this exciting and varied role at our school.



This role will be flexible to suit the needs of the school and hours are negotiable. Working days are Monday - Friday but there may be occasional weekend working in the future if the school expands its offering to the community outside of school hours.

Day to day duties could include unlocking/locking up the school, ensuring rooms are set up for functions, day to day maintenance, some cleaning, grounds works in our wonderful 'Woodland Walk', health and safety checks (full training given), and using a computerised system for logging jobs and record keeping. Helping to maintain a secure and safe environment is vital and the successful candidate will be on the overnight key holder's register and may be required to attend site in the event of a call out so living within close proximity to the school would be advantageous.

Specific trade strengths in any area would be an advantage but not essential. Lifting, moving and handling of furniture and deliveries also form an important part of the job. Full health and safety training will be provided.
