This Time next week we can thaw out The Bublé!

Can you believe that it is only 3 weeks before the end of term? Here is an update on what is coming up...

- 'Dress as you please' day will take place on *Thursday 30th November*. Please bring donations for the adult and children tombola's (bottles and games please no 'pipes of peace') and drop these off at the tables at the front of the school.
- From *Friday 1st December 'it's beginning to look a lot like Christmas'* as we will be bringing back the Christmas post box. If children would like to bring in Christmas cards for friends then please do so from this date forward. Please ensure children's name are clearly written on envelopes with their classes.
- Our amazing **PTFA** 'All I want for Christmas is You' **Fair** will take place on **Friday 1**st **December**. The children will visit the fair in their year groups during the school day so please send them in with some money, just like 'Last Christmas', for them to enjoy some of the stalls and activities on offer. They also completed a scavenger hunt for colours related to different emotions, before making a representation of the emotion using natural resources. After lunch, we played some woodland games and finished off with line drawing of leaves using acrylic pens. It was lovely to spend the day outside, and we were very grateful that the rain held off!

Last Monday, Year 2 went to the Tudor House Museum in Southampton.




