

## Message from the Multiply Team (part of Hampshire County Council) to parents

Multiply is a government funded programme aimed at improving numeracy skills for adults over 19 years. The priority target is those who do not already have a level 2 maths qualification, (e.g., GCSE or O 'Level maths grade 4/C and above, or Level 2 Functional skills in maths). However, the Government has recently relaxed the eligibility criteria, and courses are now also available to those who may have a Level 2 Maths qualification but are still anxious about maths and may have experienced a "skill fade" since they did their qualification.

On the 4th of April 2024, they are hosting a FREE family fun day at 878 AD, The Brooks Shopping Centre, <u>from 2.00pm</u> onwards for families with children aged 6 and over.
