The theme came about following a consultation with teachers and pupils by the Anti-Bullying Alliance which coordinates Anti-Bullying Week every year in England and Wales. Teachers and children wanted a theme that empowered them to do something positive to counter the harm and hurt that bullying causes.

Following the success of the campaign in 2022 when 80% of schools marked the week, reaching over 7.5 million children and young people Anti-Bullying Week will remind everyone whether it's in school, at home, in the community or online, we

can bring an end to bullying!

This year the Anti-Bullying Ambassadors will be leading an assembly at the beginning of the week. They will talk to the children about a challenge they would like them to complete throughout the week within their classes. It will also be a chance for the Anti-Bullying Ambassadors to introduce themselves and talk to the children about their role in school.

On Monday 13th November we will be participating in 'Odd Socks Day', this is a chance for children to come into school wearing any type of socks and is designed to be fun! It's an opportunity to encourage people to express themselves and celebrate their individuality and what makes us all unique!
