Hedgehogs and Rabbits

The new children arrived in Hedgehogs and Rabbits this week. They have settled in brilliantly and they are already establishing themselves incredibly well within the school.

Jungle Jonathan and his amazing Roadshow

As part of our 'Deadly 60' topic this half term, we arranged for Jonathan's Jungle Roadshow to come into school and share his selection of 'deadly' creatures with the children. We will now be writing a set of instructions, in our English lessons, on how to wash one of these animals for Jungle Jonathan!

For the rest of our day, the children created their own bug hotels in the Woodland Walk and went bug hunting, drawing sketches of what they found!

Pupil Premium

Please can I urge those families who may be entitled to free school meals to register their entitlement (please check on www.hants.gov.uk; 'education and learning', 'apply for free school meals', 'Free School Meals for pupils up to 16 years old') even if your child is in Key Stage 1 and entitled to free school meals as a matter of course. Additional funding, to be spent in aspects of provision for your child, is given to every school, based on the known free school meal figures. The funding is called Pupil Premium. More detail about the Pupil Premium will be sent out next week.

We will ensure that our concerns about our pupils are discussed with his/her parents/carers first unless we have reason to believe that such a move would be contrary to the child's welfare.

If you are concerned about a child's welfare, please record your concern, and any observations or conversation heard, and report to one of the DSL's as soon as possible on the same day.

DO **NOT** conduct your own investigation.

If your concerns relate to the actions or behaviour of a member of staff (which could suggest that she/he is unsuitable to work with children) then you should report this to the head teacher in confidence (or the LADO - Local Authority Designated Officers - on 01962 876364 if the concern relates to the Head Teacher) – who will consider what action to take.

Lost Property

During the course of the year lost property becomes an increasing problem for us with many, many items being found unnamed. At the end of the summer term, we had a small mountain of lost property! I would be grateful if you would ensure that all uniform is named, including shoes and PE kit.

Any named items that are found around the school will be returned to the child's classroom once found. Any un-named lost property will be placed in the Lost Property box outside of the School Library. This box is emptied at the end of every term and the items disposed of. If you retrieve any of your child's clothing or property from this box, please wash it thoroughly before using or wearing.

"It was very exciting, but I had to wait 6 weeks for it to come. When I got it, I thought it was the white badge, but it was actually the blue badge!"






Vacancies
