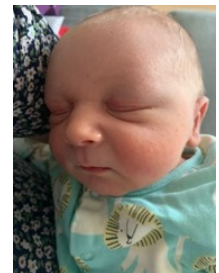

Ticket sales are open now and close on **Wednesday 13th July** in order for us to send tickets home in time for the performances. We really would love this to be a whole school celebration and the children will really benefit from a huge audience. We really want our whole school community to attend. The ticket prices are to cover the costs of the show and any extra money made will go back into drama productions for the future as we want these performances to continue long into the future.

This week, teachers were trained how to use our new 'Sensory Trail'. The trail will be used to teach and develop team building techniques including gaining trust, listening and following instructions.

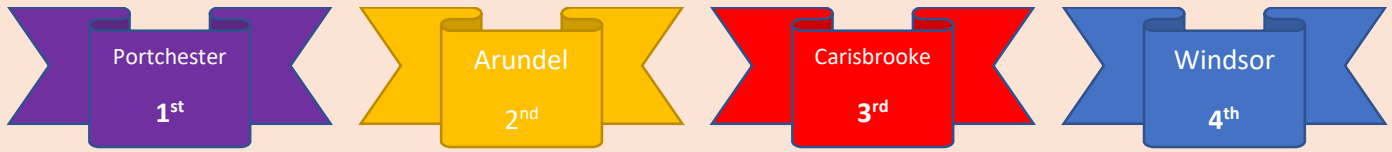

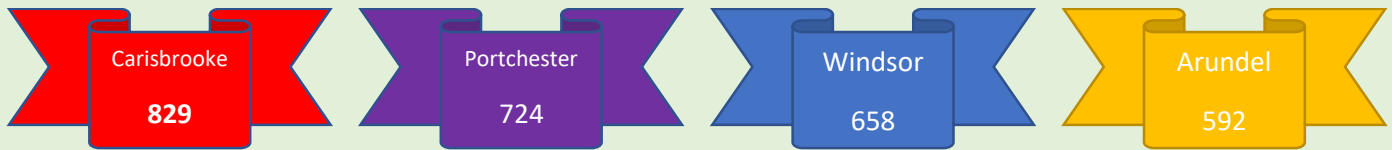
