Year 5 Winchester Science Centre Trip

In science this term, Year 5 are learning all about Earth and Space and on Tuesday, we went on an incredible trip to the Winchester Science Museum to explore our topic further. The first part of the day began with a space workshop. Year 5 learnt all about amazing space technology like the James Webb Telescope which can see the light (invisible to the human eye) given off by far away objects billions of years ago, which helps astronomers see what our universe looked like. We solved laser puzzles, experimented which colours absorb heat the least and most and even got to try on some light diffraction glasses. When light hits the lenses, it bends and breaks into its component colours, which looks like rainbows are surrounding the lights in the room. How amazing is that!! We also got to visit the planetarium and went on an immersive journey through our Solar System. After re-fuelling our tanks with some food, we were ready to explore the exhibits including the explorer: space area, the children loved seeing themselves on the infrared camera and being within the Ames illusion room.



Year 5 behaved beautifully and did an incredible job of upholding our school values throughout the day. Miss Aplin, Mr Rule and all of the other adults who helped out on our trip are feeling very proud of all the children!

“It inspired me to work hard in my keyboard lessons so I can become part of an orchestra!” - Noah 6S




Parent Support Group Meetings
