

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Pupil Premium

In Reception and Key Stage 1 **all** children have the option of receiving a free school dinner. Some families may **also** be eligible for Pupil Premium (see criteria below). Pupil Premium is only payable to the school for those children whose parents meet the eligibility criteria, but it is important for schools to be able to make use of all available resources to support your child. For every eligible child the school will receive £1,480 per year to improve learning; if you are still eligible when your child begins Key Stage 2 then your child will continue to receive Free School Meals. All information provided is confidential and please be assured that there is no difference in how your child would make their meal choice in class or receive their meal at lunchtime.

Eligibility Criteria

Your child might be eligible if you access:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on
- Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)

Your child might also be eligible if you're in a household with no recourse to public funds (NRPF), subject to a maximum income threshold. This is for children of:

- Zambrano and Chen carers (non-EEA nationals caring for a British citizen residing in the UK)
- British National (Overseas) passport holders
- Spousal visa, work visa, or student visa holders
- Those with no immigration status
- Families with a right to remain in the UK under Article 8 of the European Convention of Human Rights
- Families receiving support under Section 17 of the Children Act 1989 who are subject to a no recourse to public funds restriction
- Certain failed asylum seekers supported under Section 4 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
